Dr Augier's poem (excerpted above) was dedicated to Dr Charmaine Gardner, a member of our Eminent Persons Panel who is recovering from illness.





#### Z for Zinc



Plant scientist Laureate Dr Mahendra Persaud (Science & Technology, 2023) and his team at the Rice Research Station in Berbice, Guyana, have released the Caribbean's first zinc-enriched rice variety. The variety was released for commercial cultivation in October 2023 and is now grown in farmers' fields across Guyana. Zinc is known to strengthen the immune system and Dr Persaud says the new rice variety is a good choice for farmers and well suited for the local and export markets.

#### Liam, Arts Champion

Laureate Dr Liam Teague (Arts & Letters, 2014) was recently presented with the Champion of the Arts Award by the Fox Valley Music Consortium in Illinois, where he heads Steelpan Studies at Northern Illinois University.

Dr Teague's success followed that of his son, 16-year-old Jaden Teague-Nunez, who won the prestigious Crain-Maling Foundation CSO Young Artists Competition in February.
