The ANSA McAL Foundation will be now headed by the ANSA McAL Group's Executive Chairman, Dr A Norman Sabga, first son of the late chairman, Dr Anthony N Sabga who passed away this last May.

The Foundation, up to 2017, was the sole funder of the ANSA Caribbean Awards for Excellence. This function has since been taken over by the ANSA McAL Group of Companies.

Despite the change in the source of the Awards' funds, however, the Foundation continues to play its role as the oversight body for the Caribbean Awards. one of the leading attorneys in Antigua, and has practiced law in several territories in the region since she was first called to the Bar in 1981.

Between 1981 and 1983, she practiced in the British Virgin Islands Jurisdiction as a Prosecutor in the Chambers of the Attorney General. She moved to Antigua in 1983, and till 1990, worked as an associate in Chambers of Kendall & Henry. From 1990 to 1997, she worked as a sole practitioner and in December, 1997, she launched her own firm, the Chambers of E. Ann Henry & Associates. She was elevated to the rank of Queen's Counsel in September, 2012.

Ms. Henry was educated at the UWI Cave Hill and St Augustine. She is a Past-President of the Antigua and Barbuda Bar Association and a Past Chairman of the Council of Legal Education of the West Indies. She has been admitted to bar in Antigua and Barbuda, the British Virgin Islands, and Montserrat.

She holds Bar memberships in the OECS Bar Association, Organisation of Commonwealth Caribbean Bar Associations, and the in the field of education and she is Chair of the Commonwealth Law Association. She served as president of the Antigua/Barbuda Bar Association from 2003-2005 and was vice-president of the OECS Bar Association from 2004-2008.

Outside of legal practice, she has been an Acting Judge of the High Court, and Acting Justice of Appeal (Eastern Caribbean Supreme Court, 2008, 2013), and a member of the Industrial Court of Antigua and Barbuda.

Professor Emerita Simmons-McDonald has joined the Barbados CNC. ProfSimmons-McDonald was the Pro-Vice Chancellor and Principal of The University of the West Indies Open Campus, from 2007 to 2014. Prior to that, she served as Head,



Department of Language, Linguistics and Literature; Deputy Dean, Outreach; Deputy Dean, Planning; and Dean, Faculty of Humanities and Education at Cave Hill.

Professor Simmons-McDonald traveled widely throughout the region to enable the establishment and implementation of Open Campus services, particularly in the UWI 12 countries.

She represented the University on several boards, including the Council of the Caribbean Examinations Council and the Caribbean Knowledge and Learning Network (CKLN). She is a founding member of the literary journal Poui and the Multimedia Educational Resources for Learning and Online Teaching (MERLOT), Journal of Online Learning and Teaching (JOLT); and has served as a reviewer for scholarly texts for The Press, UWI, the Hampton Press for the Dept. of English, College of Liberal Arts and Sciences, Chicago, and The Journal of Pidgin and Creole Linguistics (JPCL).

Since retirement she continues to serve CARICOM Technical Working Group for Open and Distance Learning; Chair of the CXC review committee for English; a member of the Catholic Diocesan Committee for Education in Barbados.

In June 2014 she received an award for "Outstanding Contribution to Education" from the Global Distance Learning Congress at the World Corporate Universities Congress in India. The award came close on the heels of her being awarded the OBE in 2011 for her outstanding contribution to higher education.
