

Our 2021 Laureate in Entrepreneurship, **Dr Guna Muppuri** of Jamaica, will be conferred with a Jamaican national award. The award is, the Order of Distinction (OD), Officer Class, for service in the fields of Medicine, Pharmaceuticals and Community Service. It will be presented at that country's national awards ceremony in October.

Dr Muppuri is CEO of the multinational Bioprist Group. He began his career in public service when he worked to make generic pharmaceuticals to treat common ailments available at affordable prices for the average person in Jamaica.

He subsequently branched into rehabilitating abandoned commercial infrastructure and converting them into



offshore medical schools and knowledge parks. He is also known for his philanthropic work which includes provision of free medicine and scholarships to less fortunate communities. Dr Muppuri emigrated to Jamaica in 1992 from India, and has been honoured by both countries for his philanthropy and public service.
